# 1 Attendance Summary

This year, 24 external competitions were attended nationally, four at international level (including two World Cups) and nine internal competitions. Attendance at all of these (except for the Internationals, by virtue of the standard required) was exceptionally high - often swamping the hosting club with scoring and administrative work! This level of attendance does not go unnoticed at any level in the sport and is a very positive public image for the Club and College - those of you who participated in these competitions have just reason to feel proud.

# 2 DURC competitions hosted

DURC has only hosted one Open competition this year so far, due to the Foot & Mouth crisis which has decimated the outdoor shooting calenday this year. Our Indoor Air Rifle Open was a resounding success however - and after the debacle of the previous Open, it is a welcome sight to see that our efforts were not unnoticed - we have in fact, been requested to do the logistics and administration for the National Air Rifle Championships this weekend. Unfortunately, his Milan score of 525 proved to be the first symptom of a serious back injury which has put him out of the Air Rifle field for the moment.

**Isle of Man Easter Shoot 2001** – this was my easter holidays and proved to be a disasterous one in Air Rifle, but quite a good one in Prone Rifle. There was a heavy attendance from Irish shooters, and once again, we walked away with a full third of the prizes despite heavy competition.

## 3.3 Postal Competitions

We entered four postals this year.

UCESSA 10m Air Rifle Postal. Ben is still completing this and doing reasonably well!

UCESSA 25yd Prone Rifle Postal John and I won our divisions of this this year –John only requiring 9 out of 10 cards to do so – and the completed results from last year show John Keeney coming 3 <sup>rd</sup> in his division and me coming 4<sup>th</sup> in mine. In both years however, some people have started the competition and then not completed their ten cards – next year will see sanctions to prevent this! *ie. you will have to pay your entry fee if you miss more than one card!* 

**NSRA/Eley Postal Competition**. This is a very large and prestigous competition and this year we had several entrants, of which four (Ray Reilly, John Keeney, Alan Smyth and Ben Jones) have made it to the second of three rounds.

#### 3.3.1 Trinity Top Ten

The Top Ten this year saw less problems than last year - but almost the same amount of delays. Happily, the scores are now finalised, the prizes made, and have been put in the post to the winners, with the exception of Agnes Graham of Comber, who allready has hers (Agnes may be small in stature, but woe betide those think she's not scary when she wants to be).

# 4 Internal Competitions

#### 4.1 Ladders

#### 4.1.1 Prone Rifle

An excellent entry level for Prone this year, with 399 cards shot. The overall best was Ray Reilly with an average of 97.8; which beats his average of last year (97.388) but doesn't equal his previous year which set the club record of 98.231. Second place was me with 96.657 and John Keeney with 95.629.

The best novices were Adrian Costigan with 92.467, followed closely by Conor McDermottroe and Liam Murray on 91.367 and 91.171 respectivly.

#### 4.1.2 Air Rifle

Air Rifle saw a healthy 331 cards shot this year. The best in the experienced class by a long margin was newcomer Steven Watterson, whose average of 94.000 was well ahead of second place (Me) of 86.200. Third was Miss Aisling Broderick with 80.947: given that she was studying for scholarships this year, that's quite respectable.

Best Novice goes to Liam Murray, with 78.333. Well done Liam!

#### 4.1.3 Sporter Rifle

The sporter rifle ladder this year was a lot healthier than last year - this year sees 23 cards as opposed to none last year! The winner is old hand Frank DeSalle, with an average of 126.25.

## 4.2 Championships

#### 4.2.1 Prone Rifle

Prone Rifle's championships were closely fought this year, the winner not being decided until the very last shot fired! The winner, with a score of 98 was Steven Watterson; second on 97 was Mark Dennehy; and third was a tie with both John Keeney and Ray Reilly scoring 96.

#### 4.2.2 Air Rifle

Air Rifle went well this year for Steven, who won with a comfortable 20-point lead, scoring a 96. Second overall and best novice was Adrian Costigan on 76, followed by John Keeney on 75. After reviewing their scores, the rest of us agreed that we'd had enough and a few beers were had with Ben's chips and salsa to celebrate  $\odot$ 

#### 4.2.3 Sporter Rifle

Sporter rifle was won by Kenneth Suzuki on 134: Conor McDemottroe was second with 126; and John Keeney came in third on 124.

Last years results weren't available at the last AGM: they were Willie O'Connor (137); Mark Dennehy (131); and John Keeney (127)

#### 4.2.4 Rapid Fire

Rapid Fire was won by the novices this year, as often happens: Meredith Lulling with 89 and 3 tens won, followed by Peter Byrne on 87 and Me on 86: though note that with 9 shots, John Keeney managed 6 tens: and a score of 78. Better luck next year John!
